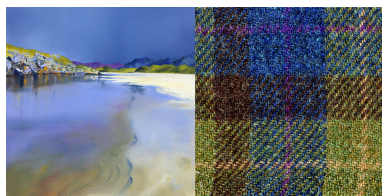

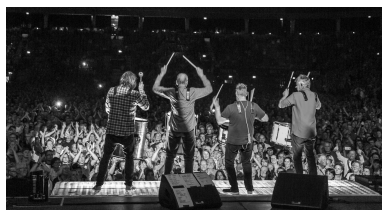
He began photographing local bands in his youth, often shooting a concert, dashing home to develop & print the images that evening, then returning the following day to sell the photos at the next show!
